FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

On MOTION by Mr. Young and seconded by Mr. Dunn, with all in favor, adoption of Resolution 2025-02, as amended to remove Suzanne Lupia as Assistant Secretary, Electing, as nominated, and Removing Officers of the District and Providing for an Effective Date, was ratified.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Public Hearing to Consider the Adoption of an Assessment Roll and the Imposition of

Special Assessments Relating to the Financing and Securing of Certain Public Improvements

A. Affidavit/Proof of Publication

B. Mailed Notice to Property Owner(s)

C. Engineer's Report for Capital Improvements (for informational purposes)

Mr. Rom presented the Engineer's Report for Capital Improvements, which is unchanged since it was last presented.

D. Master Special Assessment Methodology Report (for informational purposes)

Mr. Rom presented the Master Special Assessment Methodology Report, which is unchanged since it was last presented. He recalled prior discussion about including hardscape in the Methodology Report and noted that, although hardscape is mentioned in the Engineer's Report, it did not include a cost, which is why it was not in the Methodology Report. The Methodology Report mirrors the data and costs in the Engineer's Report.

On MOTION by Mr. Dunn and seconded by Mr. Cuarta, with all in favor, the Public Hearing was opened.

Hear testimony from the affected property owners as to the propriety and advisability
of making the improvements and funding them with special assessments on the
property.

No affected property owners or members of the public spoke.

Mr. Magee posed and Mr. Rom answered the following questions:

Mr. Magee: You are the Financial Consultant for the Master Assessment Methodology that has been previously approved by the Board? Correct?

Mr. Rom: Correct.

Mr. Magee: In your professional opinion, do the lands subject to the Master Assessment Methodology receive special benefits from the Districts Capital Improvement Plan as provided in the Engineer's Report?

Mr. Rom: Yes.

Mr. Magee: In your professional opinion, are the special assessments, as provided in the

Master Assessment Methodology reasonably apportioned among the lands subject to the

special assessments?

Mr. Rom: Yes.

Mr. Magee: In your professional opinion, is it reasonable, proper and just to assess the

costs of the Capital Improvement Program against the lands in the District in accordance with

your Methodology, which results in the special assessments set forth on the final assessment

roll?

Mr. Rom: Yes.

Mr. Magee: Is it your opinion that the special benefits the lands will receive, as set forth

in the final assessment roll, will be equal to or in excess of the maximum special assessments

thereon allocated as set forth in the Master Assessment Methodology?

Mr. Rom: Yes.

Mr. Magee: This is your opinion that it is in the best interests of the District that the

maximum special assessments be paid and collected in accordance with the Master Special

Assessment Methodology and the District's Assessment Resolution?

Mr. Rom: Yes.

On MOTION by Mr. Dunn and seconded by Mr. Cuarta, with all in favor, the

Public Hearing was closed.

Thereafter, the governing authority shall meet as an equalizing board to hear any and

all complaints as to the special assessments on a basis of justice and right.

The Board, sitting as the Equalizing Board, made no changes to the assessments.

E. Consideration of Resolution 2025-07, Authorizing District Projects for Construction

Mr. Rom presented Resolution 2025-07 and read the title. Mr. Magee discussed Resolution 2025-07, which accomplishes the following:

- Sets forth the Board's authority to adopt the Resolution.
- Makes certain findings based on the steps taken to date, as well as the evidence presented at today's hearing.
- Confirms the authorization of the District project as originally set out in the Engineer's Report, which is attached to the Resolution, as finalized today.
- Confirms the costs of the project and the costs to be paid by the special assessments.
- Equalizes, approves, confirms and levies the special assessments.
- Finalizes the special assessments and provides for the application of true-up payments.
- Provides for the allocation of special assessments and prepayment of the special assessments and method of collection for them.
- Provides that certain property owned by governments and certain property owner associations are exempt from assessments.
- Provides for the recording of an assessment notice for the official records of the County.
